Expectations

- Dogs on to the school premises (other than guide dogs).
- Smoking, taking illegal drugs or the consumption of alcohol on school premises.
- Defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments regarding the school or any of the pupils/parents/staff, at the school on Facebook or other sites.

How the school will respond to unacceptable behaviour and conduct

Welsh House Community School reserves the right to take any necessary actions to ensure all members of the school community are not subject to abuse. Therefore the school will take the following actions if we feel any behaviour is deemed abusive:

- Should anyone exhibit any of the behaviours mentioned in parental guidelines; then the school will contact the appropriate authorities.
- The school also reserves the right to ban the offending adult from the school premises.
- The school reserves the right to remove any derogatory comments from the school social network sites.
- The school will report any inappropriate or libelous comments posted online to the appropriate 'report abuse' section of the network site.
- The school will also consider legal options to deal with any such misuse on social networking and other sites.
