#### **Nursery**







During this term the Topic in Nursery has been "Let's Celebrate". The children have joined in with many celebrations including Nursery Rhyme week, Diwali and Christmas. The children have been using a range of different materials to create Diva lamps and we even turned our role play area into a Christmas post office.





#### **Reception**

























This half term Reception have had lots of fun! Our topic has been 'celebrations' so we started the half term learning about Diwali and Bonfire night. We then celebrated 'World Nursery rhyme' week. We also learned the Christmas story and practised our Nativity show. We had a visit from a theatre company and watched the pantomime 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We have also enjoyed our Christmas Post Office role play where we wrapped presents and wrote post cards.





#### Year 1

This half term, Year 1 have loved sharing their learning with their grown ups during our inspire workshop. We hope this was useful for you all. In History, we have been learning about toys from the past and even made our own toy museum to show our friends. We have been adding and subtracting in Maths using part whole models, bar models and number lines. We have also had a go at making our own bridges in science to test the strength of materials! We loved making Christingles and watching the Jack and the Beanstalk pantomime. We hope you like our calendars and cards we made using the printing methods we have been using in art. #### Year 2

This half term, the children of Year 2 have been learning all about the Great Fire of London. They have learned about the events that led to the fire, the circumstances that caused the fire to spread, and what happened after the fire to ensure that it never happened again.

They have learned about the significant people connected to the fire - Thomas Farrinor, the baker who started the fire, King Charles II, and Samuel Pepys. The children have even had a chance to write their own diary!





They used a primary source (hearth tax record) from the National Archive to find out about the residents of Pudding Lane at the time of the fire.

We ended the topic by taking part in a drama workshop all about the fire. Children acted out scenes from the fire, and were interviewed in roles about their part in the events of 1666.







#### Year 3

Year 3 have been busy practising their Christmas song "Dear Santa", and are sounding beautiful. To get in the Christmas spirit, they have also been learning about how Christmas is celebrated by various people, designing baubles, and of course showing off their festive fashion in their Christmas jumpers!

The class had a fantastic time watching the Panto "Sleeping Beauty" which they found hilarious and enjoyed singing and dancing along. The children's behaviour was excellent and they were a credit to the school.

Back in school, they have been learning about the Victorians and the Industrial Revolution, and have used drama and actions to learn their non-fiction text, "What is a Monster?" Apparently, not all monsters are scary, and some can even be rainbow coloured!















### Year 4













During this half term, Year 4 have had a great time learning. They enjoyed having parents join us for our reading inspire workshop and have also used hot seating in lessons to help them understand the characters in stories. The children are continuing to enjoy art lessons and their weekly French lessons and also their ukulele lesson with Mr George.

They enjoyed their trip to the theatre with Year 3 to watch the pantomime 'Sleeping Beauty.'

They are hard at work getting ready to make Christingles and perform to parents in our final week of school.







### Year 5


Year 5 have been working very hard this half term.

In Science, the children enjoyed the Virtual Reality Workshop.
They explored our solar system using VR headsets. We also investigated the formation of craters. The children planned and carried out an investigation to see if the size of the meteor (ball) effected the size of the crater.





In English, the children have read and acted out fairy tale adaptations before writing their own exciting fairy tale.











### Year 6

As well as fundraising for Save the Children by wearing Christmas jumpers, Year 6 have been singing their Christmas song "Cowboy Christmas" on repeat (yeehaw!). In Science, the class carried out an investigation to find out about adaptability of different bird beaks, using small objects to represent nuts and berries. One of the classes highlights recently has been the Ancient Greek day. They had so much fun finding out about the way that people lived, playing a strategy game from Ancient Greece, a quiz, trying on helmets and even holding an Olympic Games.



















## **Year RB**

This half-term in the Resource Base, we have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Great Fire of London. Life in London in 1666 was very different to the lives we live today. We all agreed that life without electricity and the internet is in itself unimaginable! A visit to Selly Manor in Bournville helped to bring the story alive, and we loved dressing up as Thomas Farriner the baker, King Charles II and Samuel Pepys the diarist and retelling the story through drama and role-play.

In English we have been reading the traditional tale, Babushka. Once again, drama helped us to get to the heart of the text. The story focuses on a grandmother who loves to clean—until she is visited by three travellers who are following a star to find the new born King, and she starts to reflect on what is important in life. The story centres around themes of love, kindness and family—and the children in RB loved creating their own, modern-day ending.
